## CALL FOR PAPERS



The International Association for Environmental Philosophy (IAEP) invites paper proposals for its annual meeting, to be held in Arlington, VA on October 31-November 2, 2009, immediately after the 48th Annual Meeting of the Society for Phenomenology and Existential Philosophy (SPEP).

Please send 1-2 page (single-spaced) proposals in Word format to IAEP Secretary Steven Vogel, [vogel@denison.edu](mailto:vogel@denison.edu). Since individual and panel proposals are chosen through an anonymous review process, names, affiliations and addresses of authors and panel must be stated only on one (1) separate cover sheet and omitted from the proposals and footnotes. Proposals should also indicate any special audio-visual or equipment needs. Authors wishing to be considered for the Prize for Best Graduate Student Essay (see below) should indicate student status on their proposal coversheet. The deadline for receipt of proposals is **March 23rd, 2009. (Please note this is an extended deadline.)** Notice of selection will arrive by mid-May.

### **\$100 PRIZE FOR BEST GRADUATE STUDENT ESSAY:**

An award of \$100 will be awarded for the best essay submitted by a graduate student. Graduate students whose proposals are accepted for the conference will be asked to submit complete papers (of no more than 3000 words) by **September 15th** for award consideration. Since submissions will be selected through an anonymous review process, names, affiliations and addresses of authors must be stated only on one (1) separate cover sheet and omitted from the papers and footnotes. Please send papers in Word format to IAEP Secretary Steven Vogel, [vogel@denison.edu](mailto:vogel@denison.edu). The winner will be announced at the conference plenary session.

The International Association for Environmental Philosophy offers a forum for the philosophical discussion of our relation to the natural environment. Embracing a broad understanding of environmental philosophy, IAEP encourages not only discussions of environmental ethics, but of environmental aesthetics, ontology, theology, the philosophy of science, political philosophy, ecofeminism, and the philosophy of technology.
